**Release**

- 4) I have read and understand all rules and will abide by all state and local laws, ordinances and Deadwood Mountain Grand Fall Brawl rules.
- 5) I will allow the tournament to use all pictures, videos and names for the media or advertising of the tournament without my prior consent and without royalty or other compensation of any kind to me.
- 6) The Deadwood Mountain Grand Fall Brawl reserves the right to accept or reject individual entries or participants for various factors requiring adjustments to each event field.

## 2011 Fall Brawl Rules

### 1. Rule Changes

These rules will remain unchanged for the year 2011. Interpretation of the rules will be left exclusively to the tournament director and are final in all matters and are not subject to appeal.

### 2. Participation

Participation as Captain is open only to tournament anglers who are 18 years of age or older. All contestants must have in their possession a valid state fishing license.

### 3. Angler Code of Conduct

Anglers participating in the Fall Brawl event shall observe this code of conduct and the applicable rules for the specific event in which they are participating. Anglers shall, at all times, conduct themselves in a manner becoming professional anglers that will not reflect unfavorably on the tour, its members, officers or representatives, tournaments or sponsors. To this end, anglers shall use their best efforts to demonstrate professionalism and integrity in support of the sport of professional fishing. Any angler who violates any of the provisions of the Angler Code of Conduct may be subject to fines, forfeiture of tournament winnings, suspension from competing in the Fall Brawl Tournament, permanent ban from competition, or any combination thereof deemed appropriate by the Deadwood Mountain Grand Fall Brawl Tournament officials.

### 4. Pre-tournament practice

Tournament practice will end at 4:00pm on September 23rd. All anglers are to be done locating fish at this time. The purchasing of information or the hiring of services will not be permitted for 5 days prior to the tournament and continuing through tournament day.

### 5. Registration and Pre-Tournament Meeting

It is mandatory that one member of each team register in person at the designated meeting site. The meeting will be held at 6:00pm on September 23rd, 2011 at Angostura Lodge, 13297 N Angostura Rd. All rules regarding weigh-in, flights, boat draw, etc, will be discussed.

### 6. Cell Phones & Information

The use of mobile communication devices, including but not limited to cell phones, marine radios, walkie talkies, CB's etc; during tournament hours are prohibited except in the case of emergency. No contact between competitors is allowed during tournament hours. The tournament director's phone number will be your responsibility to have on hand.

### 7. Sportsmanship

All contestants are required to follow high standards of sportsmanship, courtesy and conversation and to conduct themselves in a manner that will be a credit to themselves, the Fall Brawl Tournament and their sponsors, the sport of fishing, and the efforts to promote the sport. Any unfavorable conduct or action by a contestant, including but not limited to, a citation from a law enforcement officer whether ultimately guilty or not, or failure to comply with any of the official rules for Deadwood Mountain Grand Fall Brawl will be grounds for disqualification from the tournament.

### 8. Boat Operation

Competitors must maintain a minimum distance of 50 yards from another competitor unless you have their consent. You must obey all buoys and signs on the lake. All South Dakota fishing and boating regulations apply.

### 9. Boat Regulation

All boats must be a minimum of 16' in length with a properly aerated live-well to maintain a live tournament limit of walleye. Each boat must have all required U.S. Coast Guard safety equipment. All tournament boats must be cleaned of all harmful exotic plants, including milfoil and zebra mussels prior to entering tournament waters. Live-wells may be checked at any time by a tournament official.

### 10. Permitted Fishing Locations

Contestants may fish anywhere on tournament waters available to the public and accessible by boat, except areas designated as "off limits" or "no fishing" by local or federal officials or within 50 yards of a competitor's boat. All fishing must be conducted from the boat. At no time may a contestant leave the boat to land a fish or to make the boat more accessible to fishing waters. Contestants must leave and return to the official checkpoint by boat. The boat must remain in the tournament waters during the tournament day. No tournament boat may be loaded on the trailer before weigh in except with the permission of the tournament director. In the event of equipment failure or emergency, there will be only two permitted methods of returning to the official check-in: 1. By both partners remaining in the boat while being towed by water or 2. By both partners entering the boat of another tournament contestant. Under these two conditions the contestants' catches may be counted without a penalty, except for late penalties, dead-fish penalties or other penalties pertaining to other tournament rules. Contestants who elect to return to the official check-in by any other means than cited above will forfeit their day's catch to that point in time of the tournament day. Any contestant returning to check-in point will be eligible to restart and resume competition under the supervision of a tournament official. It is the sole responsibility of the contestants to locate an officer to request restart.

### 11. Official Check-In

There will be an official check-in location in the morning as well as the afternoon designated by the tournament director. It is your responsibility to check in before and after the tournament. Failure to go through the boat check, morning check-in and afternoon check-in will result in a disqualification.

### 12. Late Penalty

Contestants who are not at the official check-in area at the appointed time will be penalized 1 pound per minute deducted from the total weight including any weight to be counted toward a big bass award. Any contestant more than 15 minutes late will lose credit for that day's weight.

### 13. Severe Weather

In the event of a thunderstorm, lightning and/or severe weather, contestants may pull in to the nearest shoreline until it is safe to continue fishing. Contestants may not leave their boats during tournament hours except at the official weigh-in station or if severe weather forces them ashore.

### 14. Live Fish

Every effort must be made to keep walleye alive through the use of a properly aerated live-well. The Fall Brawl Tournament recommends the use of live

well additives that promote the healthy return of walleye to their natural habitat. A deduction of .25 pounds will be deducted from total weight for every dead fish.

### 15. Scoring

Winning contestants will be determined by a four fish limit with the total weight after any deductions for penalties. Weights will be in order from greatest to least. The Big Walleye award will be presented in the same manner.

### 16. Ties

Winners will be determined by total weight of fish, then big walleye, and finally a coin toss.

### 17. Protests

Boats 4 and 8 will be part of the Tournament Rule Committee. If there is a protest or problem, all protests must be done by them, prior to the end of weigh-in.

### 18. Insurance

Liability insurance with coverage in South Dakota, with minimum amounts of \$300,000 is required for all boats used in tournaments.

### 19. Refunds & Credits

No refunds apply at any time. At the discretion of the Tournament Director, a credit may extend to an angler if a life-threatening emergency situation or death in the family has arisen that has caused the angler to miss a tournament. Credit must carry over to the angler the following years or it is forfeited. Disqualification from a tournament for any reason will result in forfeiture of entry fee.

### 20. Anglers Waiver & Acknowledgement

Participation Agreement: I understand that this is a professional sporting event governed by the rules that have been established by tournament officials. I acknowledge that I have read and understand these rules and that these rules relate to the safety of all the participants as well as the fair sporting conduct of this event. The Tournament Official(s) shall act as referee in all disputes, and their decisions--based on their interpretations of the rules--will be final and without legal appeal. I understand that there are no refunds for tournament entry fees. Release of Liability: I acknowledge that I am participating voluntarily in the 2011 Deadwood Mountain Grand Fall Brawl. I recognize that loss of property, injury or death could arise from the fishing and boating activities contemplated by the tournament and the risks normally encountered in open water fishing from a boat may be enhanced by exposure to the elements and other risks inherent in outdoor competition. I warrant that I am in good physical and mental health and am physically capable of withstanding the rigors and requirements of a professional competition.

Photo & Video Release: I understand and agree that any and all photographs, videos or films taken during the course of my participation in the tournament, which includes me, my name and/ or my boat, may be used by the tournament organizers.
